



*Senate Bill 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 was signed into law on April 28, 2017. This legislative package invests \$54 billion over 10 years to fix roads, freeways, and bridges in communities across California and invests in additional transit and safety. These funds are split equally between state and local investments. The Central Coast has received SB 1 funds that are being used for projects across the 19th Senate District which include Santa Barbara and Ventura Counties.*

## Completed Projects

- \$1.4 million bridge project revamped two bridges on U.S. Highway 101 in Santa Barbara County.
- \$4.4 million project removed and replaced damaged concrete, repaved shoulders and ramps, and replaced striping on nearly two miles of State Route 101 in Buellton in Santa Barbara County.

## Projects Under Construction or Pre-Construction Phase

- \$10.4 million bridge project will repair Ventura Overhead on State Route 1 in the city of Ventura.
- \$2.5 million bridge project will paint the steel portion of the North Fork Matilija Creek Bridge on State Route 33 in Ventura County for preventative maintenance and extend the life of the bridge.
- \$52.3 million pavement preservation project will improve 21.6 lane miles of U.S. Highway 101 from Padre Juan Canyon Road Overcrossing to north of Punta Gorda Pedestrian Undercrossing in the City of Ventura.
- \$10.4 million bridge project will replace the Ventura Overhead Number 52-0040 on State Route 1 near the City of Ventura.
- \$15 million pavement preservation project will upgrade Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) curb ramps and improve 9 lane miles on State Route 246 from west of V Street to H Street, and SR-1 from H Street to 12th Street in Santa Barbara County.
- \$69.1 million pavement preservation project will upgrade guardrail, widen shoulders and improve 27.8 lane miles on U.S. Highway 101 from south of the Gaviota Gorge Tunnel to north of Nojoqui Creek Bridge in Santa Barbara County.
- \$9.5 million bridge project will replace and upgrade bridge rails and widen the Nojoqui Creek Bridge on U.S. Highway 101 in the City of Buellton.
- \$23.2 million preventative maintenance bridge project will install a catwalk/ inspection access system below the bridge and paint the Cold Spring Canyon Bridge on State Route 154 in Santa Barbara County.
- \$17 million bridge project will replace the San Jose Creek Bridges on U.S. Highway 101 in the City of Goleta.
- \$11.7 million bridge project will improve bridges and upgrade bridge railing on the La Colina Road Undercrossing and the Primavera Road Undercrossing on State Route 154 in the City of Santa Barbara.
